***Pupil Premium- what difference is it making?***

Listening and attention continues to be a targeted area of development with phonic planning supported with Launchpad for Literacy to identify gaps. Time to Listen sessions in Autumn term focused upon this area with resources purchased to meet the children's needs. Children were reassessed in the Spring term for progress with the Stoke on Trent Communication tool with groups adjusted. Some children will repeat Time to Listen to embed skills whilst others will move onto the Time to Talk sessions. Where required, attendance in these sessions has supported successful referrals to the Stoke on Trent Speech and Language Therapy services.

As identified in the Pupil Premium Strategy statement, the breakfast club is supported through the purchase of healthy breakfast options with children supported in making a healthy eating choice and in managing their own self-care skills, i.e. pouring milk, cleaning their own bowls.

2022/2023 has seen the Nursery Aims re-written to show a clear area of development, i.e., children aim to become Talented Tool users or Star storytellers. Phonics and Mathematics long term plans now outline a clear weekly progression of skills. Half termly auditing of resources ensure that the half termly purchase of supporting books and supporting materials around the long term Nursery Phonics plan ensures that materials are up to date and relevant to the weekly lesson plan. This approach takes into account recommendations from Launchpad for Literacy and NRICH.maths.org.

The school continue to promote the weekly library book scheme in order to encourage a love of books amongst the children and to reduce the burden of parents purchasing resources in view of the local library reducing opening hours. Phase 0 reading books have been purchased which will be sent alongside library books and homework.

Outdoor enrichment has been promoted through the purchase of resources targeting core strength utilising the expansive space available at the nursery with a view to supporting those who may have limited options in the home environment. These resources additionally support the teacher focused write dance, dough disco and writing exercises that occur in the classroom.

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All children are baselined in September to highlight areas of development with staff looking to see if a child is on track or not on track, supported by moderation of children's records. We look at a child's actual age and compare this to their developmental age.

The school constantly has a "can do" approach to teaching and learning and this is found in our I CAN progress sheets. With parents we discuss other developmental areas / skills that need to be worked on over the next few weeks, to diminish the difference, and support children to make accelerated progress according to their actual age compared to their academic age.
